


PAT'S PULSE ON ALL THINGS AWESOME IN EDUCATION



Welcome back-to-school Arts Integration Teachers! (AITs)

A whole year is waiting for you to get started - with students excited to be reunited with their friends and getting back into a routine. Make sure in the first few weeks of ArtsAround that you set clear boundaries and expectations when it comes to working with a partner or small group, since the arts can become very boisterous and loud. Especially when the students start playing instruments with their Music Teams or Ensembles - depending on what you prefer to call them.

Become one of the members of an Ensemble, the first time you are showing the students how to care for the instrument they are playing, as you demo 'best practices.' Ice cream cans or garbage cans, or pails can work as drums too.

- 1. Demonstrate the level of noise you expect when four Music Teams are all rehearsing in each corner of the room. Also make sure that the Orff player always holds two mallets, with his/her wrists light and flexible to provide a nicer sound than slamming the mallet down hard with a locked wrist. Look here:

- 2. Every Music Team must have a member who keeps a beat on a drum, so the tempo stays the same during the song. Alert children who are rushing a song or are lagging. The drummer should have two drumsticks, not one. This requires more concentration alternating both right and left-hand use. If you watch this YouTube, you will see how the children should hold a drumstick.

- 3. In some lessons you will conduct the whole class and in other lessons, the students will be jamming, improvising or reading notes, with their Music Team, as they bring sheet music to life.
