# WHAT'S PBL ABOUT?







**HAVING BEEN** in the classroom for many years, I always wanted to highlight Grade 8 students in their final year in their beloved school, which they have attended for 9 years. When you consider that elementary years are the most years some students will ever spend again in education. **WHAM!** That's worth a re-think! It was always my intent, as a teacher, to find a way to celebrate Grade 8 students, throughout their final year, and not just at graduation. As you are fully aware, school life gets so busy, it is easy to let things ride because of **'life getting in the way'.** Universally, we all have this deep need to rites of passage and celebration: a sense of completion. Sadly, we all know that feeling of **'meaning to get to it.'** Not this year, folks! Grade 8s are in for a pleasant surprise! And hopefully, so are you. PBLs (*Project Based Learning*) is on fire! And **ARTSAROUND** wants to lead the pack.

### **A HE-ART-FELT WAY**

**THINKING** of a way for an AIT to take the lead at **'highlighting Grade 8 students'** (especially in a he-ART-felt way, before their actual graduation), would mean a project had to last longer than the short period of time AITs has during **ARTSAROUND** lessons. This Project-Based-Learning (PBL), implemented accurately, will provide tremendous motivational fun for the Gr 8s, while the entire school community cheers them on! Basically, they are preparing for their own going away party!

You will soon begin to see hints, sprinkled in your Music and Dance **ARTSAROUND** lessons about a wonderful opportunity for you to highlight Grade 8 students in your schools. Before we take this Project-Based Learning (PBL) adventure together, it is a good idea to remind yourself what PBL means in a gritty sense of being successful and fulfilled. You have heard me mention about two young teachers who do a fine job of working through challenging and innovative approaches to education. As AITs it is important that you are constantly moving forward, experimenting and discovering new practices. That's what keeps you empowered and allows you to keep evolving. ## PERFORMING SKILLS, THEY WANT TO EXPLORE

**KEEP IN MIND** the students are expected to perform skills taught during **ARTSAROUND** - not whatever they want. In the introductory guidelines you already received, you were given a concise rundown of all expectations and boundaries. The kids cannot just do anything they want if it does not relate back to the skills taught in **ARTSAROUND.** For now, get better acquainted with PBLs, while you watch for instructions in the **ARTSAROUND** music and dance lessons and make sure you communicate the info I send you, with your Grade 8 teachers. For this to be the success it deserves to be, you need to cooperate, collaborate and communicate. I know teacher's schedules are loaded and to meet with your Grade 8 teachers is difficult. Therefore, most of your communication can be done via email or online.

Cut and paste whatever parts of this note that applies to the classroom teacher, especially the links to the PBL readings. Or just forward it. Gr 8 teachers will have their reasons for liking, loving or avoiding PBLs. Please shut down opinions and invite them to roll with this PBL concept as a tribute to their Gr 8 students and their involvement in **ARTSAROUND**. Their main role is to be their students' mentor, adviser, and coach. You will do the heavy lifting. And I will provide everything you need. Now that's collaboration!

## COMMUNICATE WITH YOUR GRADE 8 TEACHERS

WHEN MY NEXT ARTICLE rolls out, you will release more information to the teachers. Once **YOU** have a handle on what's expected and the kids are working on their PBL Proposals, then you may need to have one Teacher Team Meeting - even if it is on Teams, Google Meet, or Zoom - to trouble shoot and decide how you will collaboratively move forward. For now, information is on slow release.


